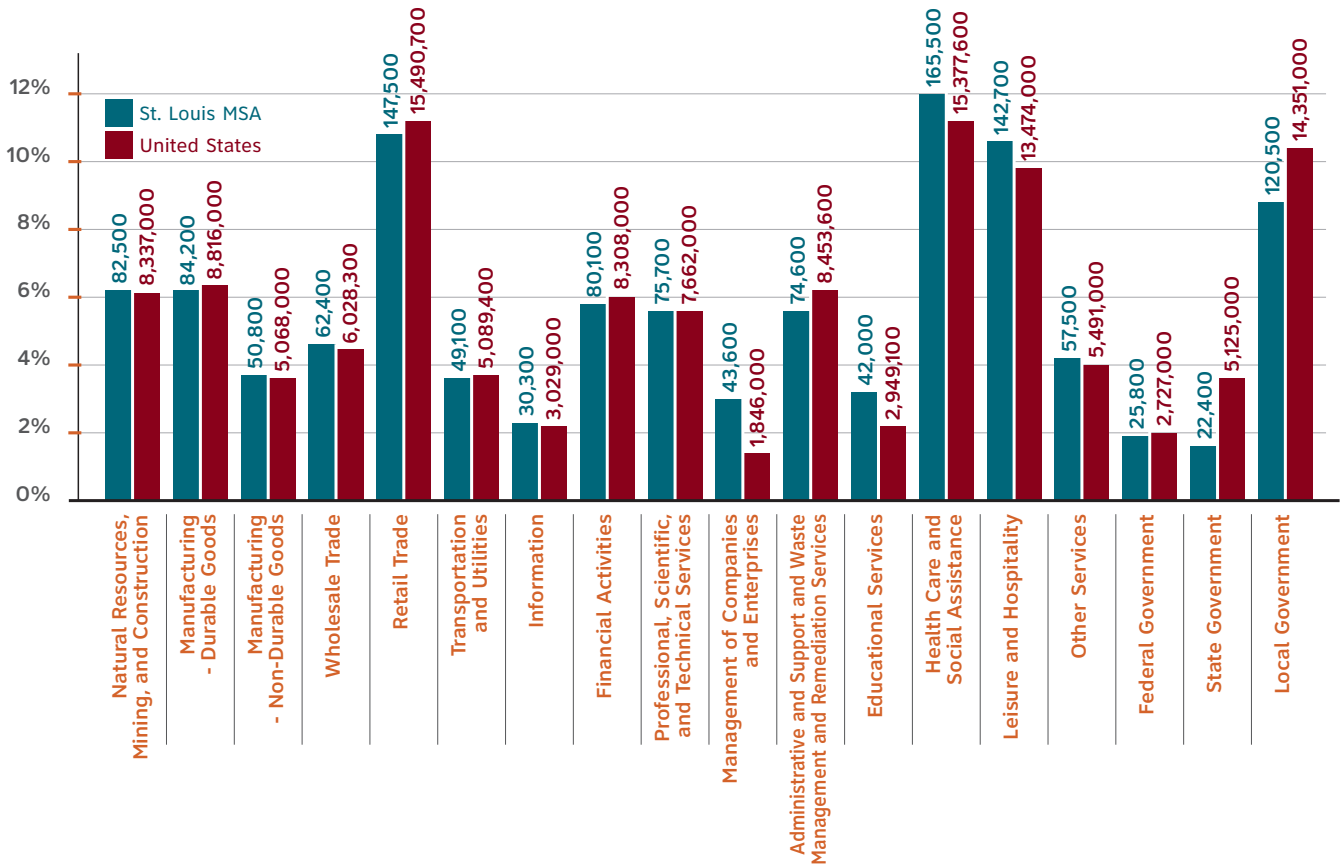

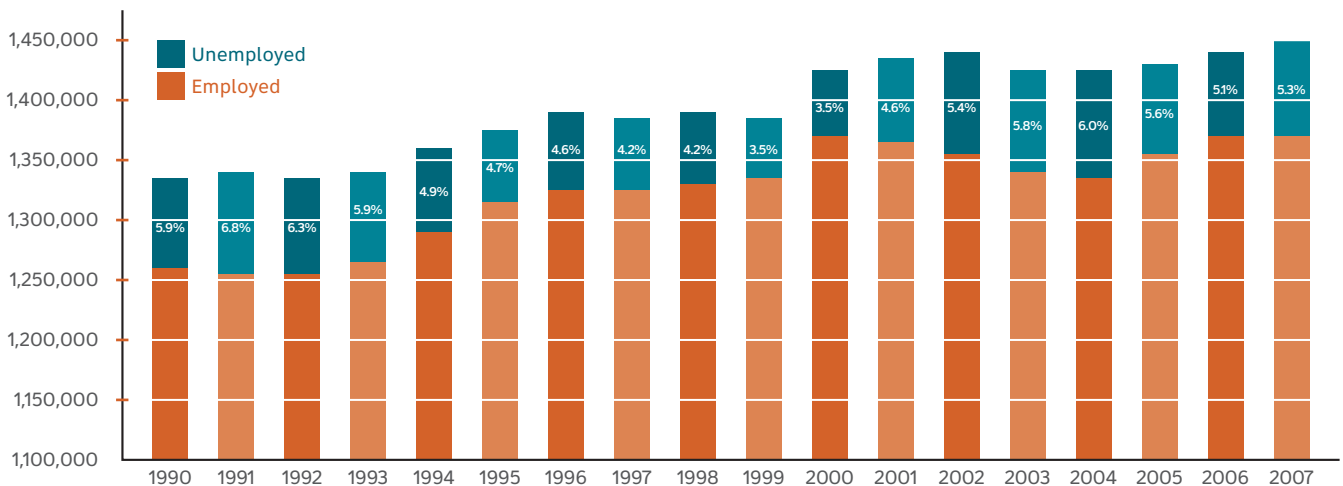

## HOW DO ST. LOUISANS GET TO WORK?<sup>1</sup>

Most St. Louis metro workers live and work in the same county (64%). The remaining 36 percent travel outside of their county of residence to travel to work. In 2007 the average commute time to work in Greater St. Louis was 24.8 minutes, slightly less than the U.S. average.
